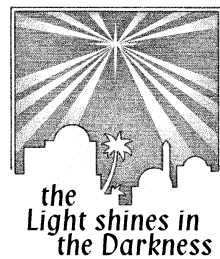


PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL

"We need a little Christmas, right this very minute."

Jerry Herman's words from the musical *Mame* have a meaning that extends far beyond the theatre stage. They speak of a yearning for the joy that Christmas brings us, be it *"carols in the window, carols at the spinet,"* gathering with loved ones around the Christmas tree, or the lights that illumine our darkness as the message of Christmas speaks "joy to the world" that is often devoid of such joyfulness. For Christians, the Christmas for which we yearn brings with it the great news that *"to us a child is born, to us a Son is given,"* the message of hope we share with all the world on this most holy night that *"to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord."* As a year filled with violence, fear, and uncertainty draws to a close, we may feel that we need the joyful message of Christmas now more than ever.

I also am looking forward to sharing in the joy of the coming Christmas season; but there is another season that invites us to share a message of hope in these days as well as in the days to come. To paraphrase the message of the classic Broadway musical, **we need a little ADVENT, right this very minute.** Advent is a season that often gets lost in all of the busyness of our Christmas preparations; people mainly



notice Advent for its four-candle wreath and the Advent calendars that many families open each day of this four-week season. While Advent is indeed a time when we prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ at Christmas, Advent is also a season when we consider what it means for Christ to come to us (Advent means "coming") not only in the manger in Bethlehem but in our Lord's presence in our daily lives and his promise that he will come again to gather us into our eternal home. Advent calls us to turn our attention away from all of the stress obligations that weigh us down during the weeks before Christmas to hear God's Word inviting us to "rejoice" because Emmanuel ("God with us") shall come to God's people to *"disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight."*

Luther D. Reed, a professor at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, invites us to embrace the season of Advent as a time of preparation for Christmas as well as all that God will bestow upon us in every season of the coming year:

- "The Lutheran Church regards [Advent] as a time of sober penitence mixed with holy joy. It serves not only as a preparation for Christmas, but as an introduction to the entire church year. Early Lutheran writers said that the Church in Advent celebrates the lowly coming of Christ in the flesh, his spiritual and daily coming in the hearts of the faithful, and his glorious return to judge. The Lessons, Collects, and other Propers stress the importance of spiritual preparation, sober living, and faithful witnessing."

We need a little Christmas (some may say a *lot* of Christmas) to bring us those tidings of comfort and joy we so desperately need. And we also need a little Advent, a time for us to prepare for the coming of our Lord at Christmas, in our everyday lives, and in that day when we will gather together to share in the good news that first came to us at Christmas: Christ the Saviour is born! The Lord is with us always! The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight!

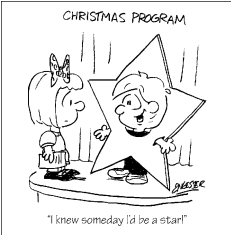

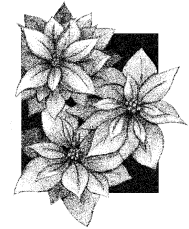
Remember we are still collecting for LWR Living & Learning Kits. Items needed are on the table at the back of the church.
