## PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL

***"Let the wise also hear and gain in learning, and the discerning acquire skill ..."*** – Proverbs 1:5.

In January 2012, I did something that I swore for decades would never happen: I returned to school. After a twenty-five year hiatus, I found myself back in the classroom as I began my studies in the Doctor of Ministry program at Virginia Theological Seminary, a school of the Episcopal (Anglican) Church. The first question many people asked was "Why?" Why return to school after being away for so many years? Why go back to lectures, assigned readings, and papers at a time in life when many people (including pastors) are able to ease back and enjoy their lives after years of hard work? Why would someone my age go back to the classroom with students who are young enough to be my children?

The answer I gave at the time was that I needed to challenge myself to grow both in knowledge and in my pastoral ministry. It is very easy for a pastor after several years of experience to "coast," to rely on old methods and practices that are tried and true. The

problem with this is that it is very easy to become stale, to cease to be effective as a preacher and teacher, and to get into a rut that can have dangerous consequences for both myself and the congregation I serve. The program at Virginia was one that appealed to me because it is geared for parish pastors (you have to be in full-time ministry to be accepted into the program) and all of the readings and assignments are focused on strengthening one's ministry. My first two years were challenging and inspiring, opening me to new understandings of pastoral practice and gathering with pastors of many different Christian traditions who shared my passion for growing in knowledge and acquiring new skills to remain relevant and effective congregational pastors.

When I accepted the call to become pastor here at Zion, I took a year's leave of absence from VTS; and during my first year here, I wondered if it would be possible to resume my work in this program. With the encouragement and support of our Council, Mutual Ministry Committee, congregational members, friends – and especially Susan – I will be returning

to Alexandria, Virginia this month to begin the third year of the program. It will be three weeks of classes, seminars, sharing case studies, and discussing my project thesis proposal for the next major part of the program: the doctoral thesis. My readings, the papers I am writing, and the preparations I am making for my return to the classroom confirm that this is a good decision and one that will greatly benefit my ministry at Zion and will hopefully inspire all of us to consider what it means for us to serve our Lord together in this time and place.

So while I'll be away for three weeks this summer, it won't exactly be a "vacation" in the usual sense; but it will be a time of renewal, reinvigoration, and refreshment that I know will bless me to return to Stratford inspired in my service among my fellow servants of God here at Zion. I'll share more about my weeks in Virginia when I return in July; in the meantime, pray that the Lord will use this program to bless all of us in the ministry we share as God's people, called to worship together, learn together, and reach out to all with the love that is ours in our great Teacher, our Lord Jesus Christ.
