PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

When I was a university student, I bought a cheap car that lived up to the adage the "you get what you pay for." It was a car that frequently broke down, or needed a jump start from one of my classmates, or began making noises that no one wants to hear from their automobile when they are on the road. My most memorable episode with this vehicle was when I was several miles from campus on a country road when the car suddenly died. In those pre-cellphone days, it meant walking quite a distance to the nearest pay phone and then walking back to wait for the tow truck. As I sat in my disabled car, I learned an important lesson about power: no matter how good or bad any vehicle may be, it is useless without a reliable source of power.

In his final words to his disciples before his ascension, our risen Lord Jesus Christ promises them that they will indeed receive the power that they will need to fulfill their apostolic mission of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. They have everything else necessary to fulfill this ministry: they have the skills, gifts and talents that people need to do the Lord's work. But Luke tells us that for ten days, they are unable to begin their task because they lack the necessary power to be the apostles of Jesus Christ. That power comes to them on the day of Pentecost, when *"all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."* (Acts 2:4).



On Sunday, June 8, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost and remember how it was only through the power of the Holy Spirit that the apostles were able to fulfill their calling to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. On this day that many people refer to as "the birthday of the Church," we remember that as each of us have also been blessed with gifts and talents to fulfill what God has called us to accomplish for the sake of our Lord and

Saviour, our gifts are also useless unless we open ourselves to the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, the means through which we can accomplish far more than any of us could possibly imagine.

In his explanation of the Third Article of the Creed in the *Small Catechism*, Martin Luther teaches us to realize that by ourselves we can accomplish nothing, but through the Spirit all things are possible:

♦ "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith."

As we celebrate our first Pentecost Sunday together this month, may we pray that our Lord will empower us so that together we may use our God-given gifts and talents in the power of the Holy Spirit so that we may with one voice *"proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."* (1 Peter 2:9).
