### FROM PASTOR JEFF

As Susan and I pour through closets, dresser drawers, and boxes to decide what we will move with us to Stratford and what we will give away or discard, we came upon a set of programs from one of our many visits to the Stratford Festival. It was a reminder of the many times we traveled to Stratford to enjoy the theatre, the restaurants, the hospitality of the people, and the beauty of the city. Little did we know at the time, of course, that one day we would be calling Stratford our home, and that I would be called to serve our Lord Jesus Christ among the people of Zion Lutheran Church! As we go through the challenges of preparing for our move, we are filled with joy and excitement as we begin this new chapter of our lives in this wonderful place.
