PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL

"Be with us, O God, as we offer to you our remembering." – F.B. MacNutt, *A War Primer*.



Once again this year, our nation will pause on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month to remember those who have given their lives in defence of our nation and for the cause of freedom. On Remembrance Day, Canadians gather in churches, town squares, Legion halls, and arenas to pay tribute to fallen soldiers and sailors, hearing John McCrae's immortal words of how *"in Flanders fields the poppies blow between the crosses, row on row,"* reminding each generation that it is *"to you from failing hands we throw the torch; be yours to hold it high."* In our prayers of remembrance, we ask that God will *"grant that*

they may rest in your peace, and that we, through our actions, may be found worthy to inherit the eternal treasures of your kingdom."

As people of faith join our fellow Canadians on this day of remembrance, God's Word calls us to consider how remembrance is not an act to be confined to a single day, but one that is at the heart of our practice of faith. As the Lord is about to liberate the people of Israel from their bondage to slavery in Egypt, he institutes the Passover meal which is to be *"a day of remembrance for you."* (Exodus 12:14). Israel is called to remember their faith as it is expressed in the *shema* (*"Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone."* – Deuteronomy 6:4) through acts of remembrance in which they *"bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."* (6:8-9). As Zechariah rejoices over the birth of his son John (the Baptist), he rejoices that through the birth of the Saviour whose way his son will prepare *"[God] has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors, and has remembered his holy covenant"* (Luke 1:72). As he institutes the Lord's Supper on the night of his last supper with his disciples, Jesus invites his followers to partake of the bread which is *"my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."* (Luke 22:19).

While our acts of remembrance call to mind what God has done for us in ages past, they also invite us to consider God's blessings in the present age and our assurance of God's presence in the future. One of our Lutheran confessional statements, the *Apology of the*

Augsburg Confession, expands our understanding of what it means when we hear our Lord's words every time we gather to receive Holy Communion:

- "Do this in remembrance of me.' For to remember Christ is not an empty celebration or a show nor something instituted for the sake of an example, the way plays celebrate the memory of Hercules or Ulysses. It is rather to remember Christ's benefits and to receive them by faith so that we are made alive through them."

November is a month in which we remember both *"all the saints who from their labours rest"* on All Saints Sunday as well as those who laid down their lives in Flanders Fields and so many other arenas of battle on Remembrance Day. As we give thanks for their lives and sacrifice, we also give thanks to the God who we are called to remember as our Lord and Saviour who we remember as *"our God in ages past, our hope for years to come, our shelter from the stormy blast, and our eternal home."*

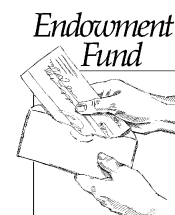

ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND



Since its inception the Endowment Fund has annually distributed Funds to needy causes on behalf of Zion Lutheran Church. The distributions are split evenly between local, national and international needs. One of the largest recipients has been Canadian World Relief in the amount of \$114,000 since 1988. Locally, we have supported the Salvation Army and the House of Blessing for a combined amount of \$62,000 over the years. Nationally, we are supporters of the Synodical Budget having contributed \$61,000 towards our Synod.

Currently these donations are distributed based on the income of the Endowment Fund. Your committee endeavours to maximize the funds available while at the same time minimizing risk of loss of principal. We will continue to provide information to the congregation through future bulletins.

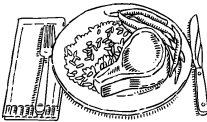
WOMEN OF FAITH NEWS
