PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL

"You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God." – 2 Corinthians 9:11-12.

Thanksgiving Day was also a very special time for me as a child. It was the day in which my family (or at least a small portion of it) gathered around a table overflowing with turkey and all of the trimmings of our beloved Thanksgiving feast. It was a time in which churches in my hometown gathered together for our annual Thanksgiving worship service, which gave us the opportunity to visit our friends' churches and experience their worship traditions. In my hometown, Thanksgiving Day featured the most important football game of the year in which my high school, North Plainfield High School, played the last game of the season against our tradition rivals at South Plainfield High School. From morning until evening, Thanksgiving was a day of great celebration and fond memories.



Of course, in my childhood Thanksgiving Day fell on the fourth Thursday in November; but no matter if you celebrate it in late November or on the second weekend in October, Thanksgiving is an occasion in which we pause to give thanks for all of the blessings God has bestowed upon us. It is a time in which we are reminded of the importance of giving thanks for all of God's blessings, to remember that *"all good gifts around us are sent from heaven above"* and that *"it is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Saviour Jesus Christ."* (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship*). As we gather at tables overflowing with the abundance of the harvest, Martin Luther calls us to remember that even though *"we plow the fields and scatter the good seed on the land ... it is fed and watered by God's almighty hand."*

· “A believing heart well perceives how our plowing and sowing would be lost unless God's goodness were here at work. Even though we must do our work

diligently and seek our food from the soil, we must in no way trust in our work as though our hands made the harvest. More is needed than our human hands. God's blessing and his mighty keeping are essential for growth.” – *Day by Day We Magnify You.*

As we prepare to celebrate our first Thanksgiving Sunday together here at Zion, we hear St. Paul remind us that thanksgiving is more for Christians than one day in which we gather to share in the abundance of the harvest that God has provided for us; thanksgiving is a way of life in which we give thanks to God for all of the blessings that our Lord bestows upon us every day, and the way in which we approach each day in recognition that *“all that we have is thine alone – a trust, O God, from thee.”* As Paul encourages the Corinthians to view thanksgiving as the way in which they live their daily lives as stewards of God's gracious gifts, so are we called upon to live each day in thanks for all that God has given us and to be as gracious and generous in sharing these blessings as God has been in showering them upon all of God's children.

· “Similarly, stewardship must be understood first as descriptive of the being – the very life – of God's people. Deeds of stewardship rise out of the being of the steward... We are able to love and perform deeds of love because we have been loved [*“We love because he first loved us.”* – 1 John 4:19]... Stewardship honours this same law: the deed springs from the gift – the gift of new life. It presupposes endowment by an abundance that must be shared with others.” – Douglas John Hall, *The Steward*.

Susan and I are looking forward to once again celebrate Thanksgiving in October in our new Canadian home; but no matter when we gather to give thanks to God (and we'll probably continue to celebrate the November day as well!) it is good for us to remember that for God's people thanksgiving is far more than one date on the calendar; it is the way in which we live each day in gratitude for all that God bestows upon us each day *“out of pure, fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or benefit of mine at all”* (*Small Catechism*), and the call to us every day as God's faithful people to *“thank and praise, serve and obey him.”* God's people are truly a thanksgiving people – in October, in November, and every day of the year!


