#### PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL

"Our Lord has written the promise of resurrection not in books alone, but in every leaf in springtime." – Martin Luther



Easter Sunday has been my favourite day of the year since I was a child. I remember waking up and finding my Easter basket filled with wonderful toys and chocolate on the dining room table, along with flowers that filled the house with beautiful aromas. We would arrive at a church filled with more flowers, with every pew packed and rousing hymns celebrating the good news that "Jesus Christ is risen today, alleluia!" After church, we would gather at the home of one of our family members for a sumptuous Easter feast, and then go out into the yard on one of the first days that was warm enough to play outside. When I became a pastor, I always looked forward to the joy of the Easter worship services after the solemnity of the

liturgies for Lent and Holy Week. Proclaiming the good news that "Christ the Lord is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!" reminded me of what a privilege it is to preach the Gospel that offers such wonderful news on Easter Sunday and on every Sunday, the weekly celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

As special as each of these Easter Sundays have been throughout my life, this coming Easter Sunday will hold special meaning for me. I am thankful that we will have the opportunity to gather for in-person worship as well as for online worship on Sunday, April 4, rejoicing in the glorious message of Christ's resurrection as we continue through the darkness and anxiety of the COVID-19 pandemic. While we will still be unable to greet each other as we have in the past, and while we will need to abide by the guidelines that have governed our worship services since last year, we will still rejoice in hearing the words of Mary Magdalene that "I have seen the Lord" (John 20:17) and give thanks to God for the blessed hope of our

faith that "indeed Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died" (1 Corinthians 15:20). During a year in which many have suffered in so many ways, and in which all of us have found our lives drastically altered, the Easter gospel brings us the good news that because Christ lives, we shall live also, and that nothing can separate us from the love of God that is ours in our crucified and risen Lord.

This Easter Sunday will also hold a special meaning for me because it will be the first Easter that I will be able to celebrate in three years. Last year, Easter Sunday occurred less than a month after our church building closed due to the pandemic, and all of us were forced to observe the day of Resurrection apart from our families as well as from our sisters and brothers in Christ. Two years ago, I missed Easter worship while I was in the throws of an illness that I later learned could have been life-threatening. I am thankful that I survived that ordeal, and that we found ways to stay connected and worship while remaining social distance out of love and respect for one another, but I am excited as I look forward to being present in our church building and online to share the good news that is at the heart of our Christian faith on the Sunday that makes all of our days possible to live in the comfort of the holy and blessed hope that "if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." (Romans 6:5).

While we are thankful for the arrival of the COVID-19 vaccines in our community and the hope that there is light at the end of this long, dark tunnel of the pandemic, we know that we still face many more months of social distancing and other restrictions that we observe so that we might fulfill Christ's commandment to love our neighbours as ourselves. We enter Holy Week and Easter lamenting all that has been lost and all that we will still not be able to enjoy during this most important week of the church year. Yet we also know that no matter what we have suffered in this past year or past several years, we look forward to a future filled with hope because it is the future God has prepared for us and in which God will be present among us with the glorious message that because Christ has been raised from the dead that we too will walk in newness of life. As we witness the promise of resurrection in the signs of new life around us, we rejoice in the blessed assurance that our Lord's resurrection assures us that even when we cannot celebrate Easter Sundays as we have in the past, we can always celebrate the Easter message that through the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour "so all will be made alive in Christ." (1 Corinthians 15:22).

- <u>Maundy Thursday Worship</u> on Thursday, April 1 at 7:30 p.m. This service of Holy Communion on the night in which Jesus instituted this holy sacrament will include the stripping of the altar in anticipation of Christ's death on Good Friday.
- <u>Good Friday Worship</u> on Friday, April 2 at 10:00 a.m. This service on the most solemn day of the year will include the reading of the Passion According to St. John and the Bidding Prayers.
- <u>Easter Sunday Worship</u> on Sunday April 4 at 10:00 a.m. will be our celebration of the glorious resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, in which we rejoice in the good news that "Jesus Christ is risen today, Alleluia!"
