LUNCH AT THE LOCAL

The LOCAL is a community/organization that serves the needs of the residents of Stratford. It is known for providing meals on Monday evenings and lunch on Fridays at noon for the hungry/lonely in our community. We at Zion are invited to come and eat, learn about the programs at the LOCAL and tour the facility on **Friday**, **December 6**th at 11:30 a.m.. The LOCAL is located at 612 Erie Street (the old Co-op).

At this meal the Deaconess Community is presenting an award of \$12,500 USD (about \$17,000 Canadian) to the LOCAL to continue its work among the residents of Stratford. Sister Jean is a member of the Deaconess Community and nominated the LOCAL for this gift. The Deaconess Community received a bequest and proceeds from the sale of property. The Community policy is to tithe all bequests. Therefore, \$140,000 was available for ministry projects and the LOCAL was chosen to receive this gift in the amount of \$12,500 USD.

If you are interested in learning about the ministry of the LOCAL, please come to lunch, meet Executive Director, Margaret Smart, learn and tour its facilities. If you plan to come, please let Sister Jean know, so that we can let our hosts know how many are coming for the lunch.

<u>CANADIAN LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF UPDATE</u>: Due to the Canada Post strike Canadian Lutheran World Relief have had to make the difficult decision to cancel their usual Advent Appeal this year, as mail delays mean they wouldn't be able to get their letter out in time.

They are vey concerned about how this might affect the people they serve around the world. A large portion of their donation revenue comes in through the mail at this time of year, and these donations ensure that they are able to provide essential support to vulnerable families and children.

CLWR have made a special request that we take a special collection for CLWR during the four weeks of Advent.
