

## **PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL**



"Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" — Isaiah 43:18-19.

The phrase "expect the unexpected "aptly describes many of my experiences in my life and ministry (including how a boy from New Jersey ended up serving as a pastor in Stratford, Ontario!). This reality of unexpected events changing the course of one's life happened to me three years ago when I received an email from my seminary requesting nominations to its alumni association board. In the past, I have usually ignored such requests, since my work as a pastor in both congregation and community filled up all my time; but for some reason, this one drew my attention to the point where

I responded with questions about the association and the responsibilities of board membership. Before long, I found my name on the nominating ballot, and three years ago I began to serve on the board of the United Lutheran Seminary Alumni Association, serving the school that was founded in 2017 as the merger of the former Gettysburg and Philadelphia Seminaries.

My board membership proved to be an enjoyable experience, and since most of the meetings were on Zoom it did not require any travel, nor did it require a tremendous amount of time. Then one day I received a message from another board member who was stepping into the role of president when the current president needed to resign for health reasons. The new president is also one of my seminary classmates, so after reminiscing about our student years

he asked if I would be willing to fill the position of vice-president that he had formerly held. Since I was enjoying my experience with the seminary alumni, I agreed to take this position; but no sooner had I agreed that I was informed that the vice-president would be in line to become the president – a position that in my wildest dreams I never thought would happen to me! After a few deep breaths, I agreed to both the current vice-president position and to the eventual position as president, which finally happened when on Tuesday, June 17 I officially became president of the alumni association of my seminary.

As if this unexpected turn of events was not enough of a change in my life and ministry, it also led to my reintroduction to the Chautauqua Institution, a wonderful summer community on the shores of Lake Chautauqua in western New York State. I was first introduced to Chautauqua during my seminary internship in Jamestown, New York and have visited there numerous times; but for some unknown reason, Susan and I had not visited there since 2004. It was at an alumni board meeting that a member mentioned that the Lutheran House on the grounds of the Institution was looking for chaplains to lead worship during the summer seasons; in another unexpected turn of events, my application was accepted and Susan and I spent a wonderful week at Chautauqua last August. Then one day (the "unexpected" theme continues!) I saw an announcement for auditions for the Chautauqua Choir for the 2025 season. Soon we found ourselves auditioning for the choir, the result being that we will be returning to this wonderful community for several weeks this summer, singing at worship and experiencing all that Chautauqua has to offer (and soon to be serving on the board of the Lutheran House).

Expecting the unexpected has not only been a recent phenomenon in my life but the call of all Christians who are called to follow our Lord Jesus Christ in the path of discipleship. It is a call to openness to new horizons and challenges, of being open to new ways in which we might serve others in Christ's name and find ourselves in situations and circumstances we never could have imagined. It is the openness to new possibilities that is at the heart of Paul's blessing in Ephesians: "Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask for or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen." (Ephesians 3:20-21).

Among the many fine lectures I have attended at Chautauqua was a week-long series with Douglas John Hall, the great Canadian theologian who taught for many years at McGill University in Montreal. I was first introduced to Dr. Hall as a seminarian, and his lectures reminded me of his writings on the future of the church, and how our mission as the church in the modern era is to "expect the unexpected," to follow our Lord on new and unfamiliar paths in the assurance that our work is not in vain, that the church of Jesus Christ will always have a mission and purpose in a world hungering for the good news of our Lord and Saviour:

• "This much, therefore, we may conclude with *confidence*: the Church that is enabled to endure the suffering of those who follow Jesus Christ into earth's uncertain future will itself have a future. Willing to lose itself for his sake who lost his life for the world's sake, it will find its life. And however insignificant and inglorious that life may appear in comparison with all that our imperial Christ past has conditioned us to expect, it will be *exceptional!*" – *The Future of the Church*.

We can "expect the unexpected," knowing that life will at times present us with challenges and opportunities that are far beyond anything we could imagine; but no matter how unexpected this future may be, we can always expect the good news that is at the heart of our faith, that "the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3:22-23). May we always have confidence to expect God to abide with us no matter how unexpected ours lives and circumstances may be!

## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE JUNE 18, 2025 CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING

The June 18, 2025 Congregational Council Meeting was held inperson in the Parlour and via Zoom.

The Congregational Council will schedule a special meeting in the fall, separate from the regular monthly Congregational Council Meeting, to further discuss the report and recommendations made by the Future Directions Task Force.

The Seniors' Luncheon was held on Friday, June 13th with 44 seniors attending and the guest speaker was a police officer from the Stratford Police Department. Following a summer break the next Seniors' Luncheon will be held on Friday, September 12th.

Our Zion Choir concluded their season of worship leadership on Sunday, May 25th and will resume singing after Labour Day.

Rally Sunday will be held in our Church building and will include the installation of the Sunday School teachers and staff at worship, the first day of Sunday School classes, and a special fellowship lunch after worship in the Fellowship Hall.

Confirmation Class had its last class meeting on Thursday, May 22nd and will resume in September.

Our Adult Bible Study class will have its final meeting on Thursday, June 26th and will resume in September.

To date, 242 tickets have been sold for the "We Three Kings" Elvis concert on July 27th.

Ritz Architect was in to complete their egress assessment and found that the stairwell from the courtyard entrance to the Fellowship Hall could not accommodate a platform lift.
