WELCOME: This morning let us extend a warm Zion welcome to Dr. Wayne Carroll who will be accompanying us on the organ. Please continue reading below to get to know him.

Dr. Wayne Carroll has enjoyed more than half a century as an educator, conductor, organist and Director of Music; 41 of these years at Knox Presbyterian Church, in St. Thomas. While at Knox he built the 12 voice choir to over 50 singers, consulted with the Dodington and Dodington pipe Organ Company to see the Knox organ rebuilt and enlarged. This project included purchasing a 1974 Casavant console and having it totally refurbished, taking the original organ from 34 ranks to a 73 rank 91 stop organ, with the addition of an antiphonal division. Additional projects included, arranging and accepting gifts of two C 7 Yamaha grand pianos and planning and overseeing a complete rebuilding of the choir loft. Dr. Carroll raised the funds for these projects through private gifts and concerts. All of this was completed over a 35 year period during Dr. Carroll's 41 year tenure. A highlight of his career as an educator was the ten years he spent as Director of Music and Arts at Alma College in St. Thomas. There he developed the largest private school music department in Canada; private weekly lessons increased from 80 to over 350. While at Alma College Wayne raised the funds to purchase 9 rebuilt grand pianos, five of which were Steinways. Community service participation include Board of Directors of Orchestra London, Canadian Music Competition Board, Steering Committee at George Brown College Toronto for the creating of a certified piano technician's course, which is now a degree course at Western University, Board member for the Western Ontario Conservatory of Music in London and board member of Amtelecom Inc. He was the founding director of the Aylmer Concert Singers, The West Elgin Choral Society and is currently the conductor of the Belmont Community Singers. Since Dr. Carroll's retirement from active church organ duties he enjoys performing frequently in the St. Francis Piano Trio, conducting a chamber music string ensemble and performing church organist requirements on an occasional basis.
