



PASTOR'S DEVOTIONAL

"When the days drew near for [Jesus] to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem." – Luke 9:51.



While driving on Highway 401 may not be the most pleasant motoring experience in Ontario, one advantage it offers are the OnRoute rest areas that are located along the entire length of the roadway from Windsor to the Quebec border. These rest stops offer amenities such as washrooms, restaurants and convenience stores, and gas stations to take care of the needs of travelers on the most heavily traveled highway in North America. While I have taken many long-distance trips along the 401 and other major roadways in Canada and the USA, I am finding that it has become increasingly important for me to take advantage of these rest areas to get out of the car, stretch out my body, and take a break from the concentration necessary for driving these busy highways. I often plan my trips so that such rest areas are always located in good places for my break times as I drive to my desired destination.

One of the features of OnRoute and other rest areas are highway maps that inform travellers as to where they are at the present time and how far it may be to their destination. I have found these maps especially helpful when I am travelling on a new and unfamiliar road; while I always plan my trips in advance, it is good to know where I am on my journey and how far I have to drive to reach my destination. It helps me understand how I have arrived at my current location and where I still need to travel to reach my intended final stop.

A major portion of the Gospel of Luke features our Lord Jesus Christ on the journey to the destination that is not only on his personal itinerary but is the place where he will fulfill his purpose in being the Saviour of all humanity. The Evangelist tells us that this journey began when Jesus “*set his face to go to Jerusalem*” (Luke 9:51), and for the next several chapters of this journey our Lord continues to travel to this destination, with stops along the way for teaching, preaching, and healing. Jesus will visit with Mary and Martha in Bethany, teach his disciples about prayer through Luke’s version of the Lord’s Prayer, share his famous parable of the Prodigal Son, and call Zacchaeus the tax collector down from the sycamore tree so that our Lord might proclaim that “*today salvation has come to this house, because he too is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost*” (Luke 19:9-10). His journey reaches his destination when he enters Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, and through what we know as Holy Week Jesus will share his Last Supper with his disciples, pray at the Garden of Gethsemane, be arrested and condemned to death by Pontius Pilate, die on the cross on Good Friday, and be raised from the dead on Easter Sunday. The Gospel would not be “good news” if Jesus had not taken this journey to the destination where through his death and resurrection all who have been baptized in his name have been “*given a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead*” (1 Peter 1:3).

As we remember Jesus’ journey to the destination where he freed us “*from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and his innocent suffering and death*” (*Small Catechism*) during the holy season of Lent which begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 18, we are also invited to remember his journey and to consider our journeys as his people in this time and place. Here in Stratford, we will again gather for our Lenten Luncheon series for six Wednesdays beginning on February 18. This beloved annual tradition invites people from our community to gather for lunch and worship at Immaculate Conception Roman Catholic Church where this year we will hear sermons on the theme “*How did you get here? Where does the church in community go from here?*” As Jesus’ ministry was defined by his journey to the place where he fulfilled God’s Will for all humanity, we will be invited to consider how our journeys have brought us to this time and place, and where we see the journey of our church in this community and in our world going from here. Our preachers will include members of the Stratford and District Council of Churches Executive; I will have the privilege of preaching on Wednesday, March 18.

As we gather for these times of fellowship and worship, we are also thankful to the people of Immaculate Conception and especially the members of the Catholic Women’s League for their gracious hospitality to hosting our Lenten Luncheons for many years. Sadly, this will be the last year that we will be meeting at Immaculate Conception as the parish will be closing later in 2026. We are thankful to God for the ministry of this parish in our community and pray for

the people who have worshipped and served among us as we look forward to where our journey as God's people in Stratford will take us in our future.

As the snow is falling outside, I am planning trips in the warmer months of the year that will include stops at rest areas where I will undoubtedly check the maps to see where I am and where I will need to journey. As we follow our Lord in the way that leads to the Cross and the joy of Christ's resurrection, let us journey together in the presence of our Lord who has been *"our help in ages past, our hope for years to come; our shelter from the stormy blast, and our eternal home."* (ELW Hymn 632).

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE DECEMBER 10, 2025 CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING

The December 10, 2025 Congregational Council Meeting was held in-person in the Parlour and by Zoom.

Pastor Jeff, on behalf of the Worship & Music Committee, was pleased to advise that a new Interim Minister of Music, namely Stéphane Potvin commenced his duties at the beginning of December.

The eavestrough from the handicapped parking lot to the ramp has now been repaired. Both inclined platform lifts have been installed and have passed the Technical Standards & Safety Authority (TSSA) inspection. Training on the operation of the lifts has commenced with the ushers. In due course, training will also be offered to other individuals. Regarding the proposed crosswalk at Erie and St. David Street, we have now been informed by the City of Stratford Engineering Department that since Erie Street is a provincial highway, installation of a crosswalk will also require provincial approval. Therefore, the completion date is uncertain at this time.

The next coffee hour is December 14 and will be hosted by the Sunday School. The first coffee hour for 2026 will be Sunday, January 11, 2026 and will be hosted by Congregational Council.

A fundraising concert is being organized for Sunday May 31, 2026, in the sanctuary, 2:00 pm – 4:30 pm. More information will follow in the coming months.

UPDATE – INCLINED PLATFORM LIFTS



We are very pleased to advise that the two Lifts at the main entranceway to the Church are now operational.

This has been a long time in coming for our Church, so this is a “milestone moment” for Zion Church. These two Lifts will greatly assist members, entering the Church at the main entranceway, in gaining access to the sanctuary as well as gaining access to the

Fellowship Hall and Washrooms once inside the building.

We are now in the process of training the Ushers in the operation of the Lifts. In due course, other members of the church will be trained as well in the operation of the Lifts.

For those members unable to enter the Church at the main entranceway, it is to be remembered that gaining access to the sanctuary from outside the building is the same as before the Lifts were installed, namely, using the ramp off of the Handicapped Parking Lot at the rear of the Church.

As we continue to embark on this journey, we advise that plans are being formulated presently as to the dedication of the Inclined Platform Lifts sometime in the future.

We extend our sincere appreciation to Tim Iredale, Chairperson of the Accessibility Advisory Committee, for overseeing this very important project for our Church over the past few years, but especially this past year as the Lifts came to fruition. Appreciation is also extended to Darrell Renecker for all his involvement as a member of our Property Committee.
